Self-Defense Classes to be Offered through Independent Living:

The Independent Living program is excited to announce self-defense classes are being offered on Monday, December 5th and Tuesday, December 6th at CSC. Feedback from many clients including how they feel unsafe and vulnerable when travelling outdoors in neighborhoods and communities mostly because of vision impairments and blindness led to this initiative driven by Scott Williams-Riseng. Trainings will be provided by the group 1Touch from California and sponsored by the Ohio Lions Club. Due to enthusiastic response, both classes are full. There may be more ongoing self-defense classes at Cleveland Sight Center in the future. - On Friday, November 11th, Erin St. Denis and Keith Filip present at the AERO conference in Columbus on the rehabilitation continuum of Argus II patients. The Argus II is a retinal implant providing stimulation for light perception for individuals who have lost their vision due to retinitis pigmentosa. Erin and Keith have provided rehabilitation for six patients receiving their Argus II implant from the Cleveland Clinic and will be starting rehabilitation for their 7th patient next week.
- Representatives from Cleveland Metroparks will visit Cleveland Sight Center on Wednesday, November 16th from 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the Clyde E. Williams, Jr. Auditorium to present their accessibility plan

and get input and suggestions about the plan from people who are blind and have low vision. Did You Know?

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in the First World War, then known as "the Great War." Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning the following year, November 11th became a legal federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. American effort during <u>World War II</u> (1941-1945) saw the greatest mobilization of the U.S. Army, Navy,

Marines and Air Force in the nation's history (more than 16 million people); some 5.7 million more served in the <u>Korean War</u> (1950 to 1953). In 1954, after lobbying efforts by veterans' service organizations, the 83rd U.S. Congress amended the 1938 act that had made Armistice Day a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans." President <u>Dwight D. Eisenhower</u> signed the legislation on June 1st, 1954. From then on, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.
