What's Happening at CSC:

-Monday marked the launch of the Ohio Department of Education's (ODE) transition to the OH ID web portal, meaning a change to any ODE web user's log-in information and the way those users access ODE online. This change impacted 500,000 users. Users of this system are teachers renewing licenses, parents completing applications for scholarships or education administrators looking to perform their daily tasks. CSC's Call Center team prepared with a great amount of training the week prior to meet the demands and the entire Call Center team stepped up to the challenge! In one day, the Call Center received 1,639 phone calls and fielded 250 emails all while handling an additional 800 plus calls from other customers, making Monday the second-highest call volume day in the Call Center's history! The commitment of the Call Center team to exceed customer expectations was on display once again. CSC received outstanding feedback on the success of the rollout due to all the individuals on the team going above and beyond to meet a customer's need. Way to go, Call Center team!

-Dr. Richard Cirillo and Martha DiLorenzo from Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities came to CSC on Friday, May 10th to train CSC's direct service providers on Conflict Prevention and De-escalation. Over 30 staff members attended the session that covered critical issues such as trauma informed care, setting effective limits, offering choices, active listening and more. Thank you to everyone for attending and special thanks to Jennifer Dean, Ralph Johnson, Jenny Schaeffer, Erin St. Denis, Ali Thomas and Taylor Volrich for role playing to reinforce the learning and to Bobbie Christopher and Scott Malone for all their assistance with set up, clean up and tracking and Barbara Piascik for taking pictures at the training event.
