From Your Friends in the Eyedea Shop:

- In honor of CSC's White Cane Walk on Saturday, the Eyedea Shop reminds you that the store carries white canes of many kinds. Aluminum canes are available for \$28.00, graphite canes for \$48.50, telescoping canes for \$45.00. The Shop also has canes that collapse or that are rigid for \$30.00. All the canes are white with a red tip that identifies you as someone who is blind or visually impaired. The aluminum and graphite canes are available in even inch measurements and the telescoping canes come in odd number inch sizing. The support canes are adjustable. Customers will need to be measured for a cane unless the length is known from previous experience. Come in and the staff at the Eyedea Shop will be happy to help. Many different cane tips are available as well as cane repairs are offered at minimal cost.
- The Eyedea Shop's clearance item this week is a limited quantity of sun glasses. Stop in soon as there are very few to choose from.
- If you are or someone you know is an artist who is blind or has low vision, consider submitting artwork to grace the cover of some of the 2018 Holiday Cards. The requirements for this year's cards are as follows: artist must be blind or have low vision; two submissions per artist; if submitting in digital format, artwork must be 300 DPI, entry window is May 7, 2018 August 10, 2018; submit entries to bpiascik@clevelandsightcenter.org. Items of Note:

- The Children's & Young Adult Services (CYAS) department is gearing up for the start of their summer programs. CSC's Summer Youth Work Experience (SYWE) program is a summer transitional program for young adults who are blind or visually impaired. It is a five week residential program providing a paid work experience, instruction in job readiness and "soft skills", one-on-one or small group instruction in the areas of orientation and mobility, computer skills and activities of daily living. For most participants, this program is his or her first real job and first opportunity to experience independent living. This year's program begins Monday, June 11th and runs through Friday, July 13th. Bright Futures Preschool Day Camp is for children with blindness or vision impairment who are entering or returning to preschool and includes occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy, orientation & mobility and more. The camp will be held Mondays through Thursdays at CSC starting Monday June 11th and ending Thursday, July 5th. For more information on these programs, contact Sylvia Snyder (x8777).
