Strengthening Partnerships and Educating the Community:

-The new date for the ADA Day Resource Fair at University Circle's Wade Oval is Wednesday, August 7th and in addition to the Resource Fair, it will be "Cleveland Sports Night" including the Cleveland Cavaliers "All for Fun" Tour, Cleveland Indians Hot Dog Mascot Race around Wade Oval, a concert at 6:00 p.m. and the film "Captain Marvel" will be shown at 9:00 p.m.

-CSC's Outreach team presented on Assistive Technology at Sherri Park Apartments in Lyndhurst this week and welcomed a delegation of 11 people from Belarus, including their interpreters, representing various agencies to learn about how CSC is able to empower people with vision loss to realize their full potential and to shape the community's vision of that potential. The group also toured the CSC facility on Friday.

The "Low Vision Principles" presentation will cover the basics about how to understand and interpret data such as visual acuity, visual fields, refractive errors for glasses and bioptic telescopic spectacles. All are welcome – please make sure you have supervisor approval. Come prepared with your questions or email <u>Dr. Balciunas</u> specific topics you would like her to cover.
