Now Enrolling at Bright Futures Preschool:

- CSC's Bright Futures Preschool is enrolling for the 2017-2018 school year. Cleveland Sight Center offers specialized instruction and educational opportunities to children ages 3-5 at Bright Futures Preschool, which is licensed by the Ohio Department of Education and located within CSC's main building. The program offers a hands-on teaching approach to promote academic, social, communication and behavior skills and gross and fine motor development. Learning in the form of exploration and discovery is incorporated into daily activities.



Did You Know?
